

Lost or Runaway Wheaten Action Plan and Reference

1. Timing is the most important fact. The first 48 hours are the most critical.
2. Get all of your facts down of details on how your dog went missing.
3. Contact your breeder or the person that you have listed on your chip as an emergency contact.
4. Make a poster and try to attach a picture or identification traits and post at parks, or any of the special places you and your dog frequent.
5. Post in neighborhood schools as kids go places adults seldom frequent
6. Contact all the shelters in a 10 mile radius of your home.
7. Contact your city or county Animal Control office.
8. Let your vet know.
9. Helpful to post in Community-Pet section on Craig's list all of the identification information you can think of.
10. Contact neighborhood police and fire stations. Post flyers
